GALA HISTORY

The Auburn Student Veterans Association (ASVA) is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit student organization committed to supporting Auburn University's student veterans and their families. From the moment they transition into student life until their graduation, the ASVA recognizes the unique needs of student veterans and exists to provide them with the means for success. The ASVA hosts a variety of acclaimed programs and events to support student veterans and celebrate, among which is the ASVA Scholarship Gala.

First held in 2016, this event raises funds for scholarships, professional development opportunities and mentorship programs; tools that facilitate successful transitions from military service to academic and civilian life. Financial aid provided by the ASVA is designed to offer the necessary assistance for pursuing one's education without disrupting student veterans' existing sources of aid. The inaugural ASVA Scholarship Gala saw 200 attendees and was organized under the leadership of the ASVA's then-President Brett Warren, United States Air Force, and his Vice President Daniel Robinson, United States Army. Despite its hiatus during the Covid-19 pandemic, the gala continues to grow and flourish, boasting a triumphant return in 2022 with more than 300 attendees and \$7,000 in scholarships awarded.

The gala has a profound impact on the lives of student veterans. To reflect our devotion to student veterans, the ASVA has set the ambitious goal of awarding \$100,000 in scholarships during our upcoming 2024 gala. By providing scholarships and access to invaluable resources, the gala empowers student veterans to overcome financial barriers and achieve their educational goals. Additionally, the gala serves as a platform to raise awareness surrounding the challenges facing student veterans and the importance of supporting their reentry into civilian and student life.

The ASVA Scholarship Gala stands as a testament to the unwavering commitment of Auburn University, the community and ASVA to backing student veterans throughout their academic journey. By honoring their sacrifices and providing crucial resources, the gala plays a pivotal role in ensuring student veterans receive the recognition and support they deserve. The 2024 gala promises to be the most impactful event to date, furthering the ASVA's mission of empowering student veterans to thrive in their educational pursuits and beyond. 
KEYNOTE SPEAKER

JEFF STRUECKER

Jeff Struecker was a decorated soldier. At age 18, he enlisted in the United States Army as an infantryman and retired as a chaplain with over 22 years of active federal service. In 2017, he was inducted into the US Army Ranger Hall of Fame. He served for ten years in the 75th Ranger Regiment in positions from private to platoon sergeant. While serving in this unit, Jeff competed in and won the David L. Grange Best Ranger Competition in 1996. He taught ROTC at the University of Louisville and was recognized in 1998 as the US Army ROTC, Non-Commissioned Officer of the Year. Jeff spent his final ten years in the US Army serving as a chaplain in Airborne and Ranger units. Throughout his career, Jeff has attended numerous professional military schools and has received many awards and commendations. Some of his awards include the Ranger Tab, Combat Infantryman's Badge, Pathfinder Badge, Master Parachutists Wings, Military



Freefall Master Parachutist Wings, several foreign jump wings and the Combat Action Badge. He has been awarded other commendations and decorations throughout his military career. His combat experience includes participation in the invasion of Panama, Operation Desert Storm, Black Hawk Down in Somalia and more than a dozen combat tours in Afghanistan and Iraq. Jeff has been awarded medals for valor in combat and has received many medals as recognition for his service in the US Army. Jeff holds a Ph.D. from Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary in Wake Forest, North Carolina. He also has several other earned and honorary degrees. He is the lead pastor of 2 Cities Church in Columbus, Georgia. He in an award-winning author with five books in print. He and his wife, Dawn, have five children and four grandchildren.

Luther Parker Memorial Scholarship

The Luther Daniel Parker Memorial Scholarship cements a lasting legacy of his commitment to those principles enumerated in the Auburn Creed – especially love of country and hard work. He believed in hard work, honesty and truthfulness, mutual respect, a sound body and mind, obedience to law and the human touch. But most of all, he believed in the United States of America and in serving his country.

Jed Grant Perseverance Award

The Jed Grant Perseverance Award is named in honor of Jed Grant, a veteran of the United States Marine Corps and cancer survivor. Jed is a brave individual who embodied unwavering perseverance throughout his journey as a student veteran. Facing significant challenges, Jed Grant overcame obstacles and achieved personal and academic success. This award recognizes a student veteran who has demonstrated remarkable resilience, determination and the ability to overcome adversity.

Johnny Lawrence Achievement Award

(Johnny Lawrence Memorial Award)

The Johnny Lawrence Achievement Award is presented to a student veteran who has demonstrated outstanding accomplishments in their academic pursuits, extracurricular activities and community involvement. This award honors a longtime Auburn public servant and veteran supporter, Mr. Johnny Lawrence. Johnny served almost 50 years for the Auburn and Lee County communities, advocating for local veterans and promoting their causes. His leadership led to Auburn University receiving its designation as a Purple Heart University. This award is reflective of Johnny's dedication to service before self and acknowledges the recipient's exceptional achievements.

Excellence Award

The Excellence Award is bestowed upon a student veteran who has consistently displayed exceptional academic performance, setting a high standard of excellence for their peers. This award acknowledges their commitment to knowledge, learning and intellectual growth.

Mr. Brightside Award

(Josh Marshall Memorial Award)

The Mr. Brightside Award is a poignant recognition named after Josh Marshall, a member of the Auburn Student Veterans Association who tragically lost his life. Josh Marshall, a veteran of the United States Navy, was known for his optimism and positive attitude. This award is presented to a student veteran who has exemplified resilience, optimism and a positive attitude in the face of adversity. It acknowledges their ability to inspire others and spread hope, even in challenging times.


